ADL College Antisemitism Summer Training

Many of us have heard gut-wrenching stories from Jewish college students or watched recent news about the experiences of antisemitism on college campuses, starting before and worsening since October 7 last year. ADL is responding to the need of our community by helping Jewish students process what they have experienced and equip them to return to campus in the fall.

This summer, ADL Midwest is hosting training sessions for college students that will address antisemitism on campuses. Each session will consist of identifying, discussing, and processing antisemitism. Students will learn to better understand what they are hearing and witnessing. In response, they will be empowered to create meaningful dialogue and utilize ADL and university resources to respond to antisemitism on their campus.
